



## **Irregular/Heavy Bleeding/Pain**

Abnormal menstruation, pain, and vaginal bleeding can be caused by a variety of factors. Your doctor may evaluate your symptoms using blood and/or hormone tests, obtaining a cervical culture, or performing a pap smear, ultrasound, or laparoscopy.

Treatment depends on what cause for the bleeding was determined.
